



An illustrated, otherworldly autobiography of the oddest order. On August 16, 1987, the “Harmonic Convergence” that took place, unbeknownst to most people, left first-time author Heywood-Babrauskas in a permanently altered state, her book reports. While approaching a Stonehenge replica in Maryhill, Wash., this cosmic event, manifested in a dazzling ray of light, unveiled to her a higher plane of existence through the world of electromagnetic energy. Readers can appreciate the gravity of this occurrence by noting a new strand of pink splitting the green band of any rainbow. Through years of journal entries interspersed with random expositions on events disclosed therein, we learn that pink is the color of the electromagnetic likeness of the author’s “Christ Self,” the so-called “Passionate Pinky” who has revealed himself to her. The author’s own inner light-print, if you will, of a more rosy color, has since merged with Pinky to form the Order of Pink Roses, the mission of which is to preserve universal good. While readers may question the applicability of the spiritual teachings advanced here, the work’s entertainment value is beyond dispute. Readers will also be thankful that the author doesn’t live in a densely populated area, as she is often so overcome by her Christ-bride experiences that she frequently drives off the road to recover. Because the text contains countless intimate revelations of moments of communion with her “inner family,” in addition to accompanying colorful illustrations, it would appear on first reflection to be entirely saturated with vague New Age hokum. But the more the author details the sensual and often sexual nature of her experiences with spiritual likenesses or the dimensions that open up through her practice of free-form dance, the more the work parallels that of early mystics like Hildegard von Bingen or Teresa of Avila—women so moved by their baffling raptures with Christ that they felt compelled to recount them on paper. A roller coaster of 21st-century visionary writing.

Passionate Pinky and The Evolutionary Experiment

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The intriguingly titled "Passionate Pinky and the Evolutionary Experiment" is Carol Heywood-Babrauskas' personal lure to urge each of us to turn within ourselves and experience the inner Beauty, Light, and Love that lie in all of us.

Heywood-Babrauskas led what she calls a "regular" life until, in 1987, during the Harmonic Convergence, an energy wave triggered her pineal gland (or third eye), opening to her "a whole new realm of Beauty beyond description." She proceeded to found a worldwide fellowship, the Order of Pink Roses, to connect people through Unconditional Love. Heywood-Babrauskas herself is the evolutionary experiment referred to in the title - an "evolutionary early bloomer" whose Heaven-Earth connection was activated earlier than most.

Since every such inward journey will be uniquely personal, Heywood-Babrauskas does not set down a rigid system to follow; rather, she details her own voyage of discovery to share her experiences. She provides, for example, her personal numerical message code, as well as her interpretations of rainbows and stellar arrangements. She also narrates how Christ, "in the form of a bright pink pulsing and spiraling hurricane," entered her being, providing her access to passionate Unconditional Love.

"Passionate Pinky and the Evolutionary Experiment" is written in the form of a diary, and Heywood-Babrauskas' conversational tone makes the book a riveting read. She is extremely honest throughout; when, for instance, she first opened up to the idea of discussing sex and romantic love with the Spirit, she freely admits that she was flabbergasted. When she switched from watching a movie on corporate greed to news on another channel of the South-Asian tsunami, she sees them as related events, a "turning point" in a new Earth cycle.

Heywood-Babrauskas also includes her beautiful artistic works that grew out of her newfound connection to her Inner Beauty, boldly colored and exuberant with life. Throughout various points in her journey - domestic strife, the news of war, illness, vacations - Heywood-Babrauskas uses her newfound love of life, and her inner strength and spirit to tide her over, always, to the shores of Unconditional Love.
